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Dear Kennedy Family,

I very much enjoy the opportunity to reflect on all that we have accomplished at John F. Kennedy Catholic School during the previous school year. What our students achieved, the projects we completed, new ideas that were hatched, and the success of our programming.

I had the good fortune to attend a few celebrations this summer. The first was our Summer Social - Reminisce & Rediscover JFK. We had the opportunity to host the unique classes of 1965, 1966, and 1967 who had the distinction of attending both St. Mary's High School and John F. Kennedy Catholic School. Years later, they were able to speak so clearly about the trepidation of starting new and the exhilaration of leading the next generation of students to our building. I also had the pleasure of visiting with the Class of 1958 during their 60th reunion. Listening to the stories and hearing the history that is both St. Mary's and Kennedy helped me to understand that even though our alumni did not all attend the same physical building, the purpose and mission of our education was always the same and remains so today.

We implemented numerous new programs during the school year. Our Junior High Speech and Debate team had 40 participants; 23 made it to State level competition, and 11 amazing kids who competed at Nationals in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. Our Entrepreneurship Class, launched in the Think Lab, began producing banners, fliers, and signs for local businesses, charities, and our own Kennedy families. We received a \$100,000 grant from **The Cafaro Foundation** and broke ground on a dedicated space for our growing Band program at the Upper Campus. Finally, we celebrated the back-to-back State Championship title of our Cheerleaders and the students who achieved this opportunity to participate in state level athletic competition in girls tennis (**Kaytlin Martlett**) and **Lauren Kraker** Boys Tennis (**Armand Nannicola**), and Boys Golf (**Jimmy Graham**).

Our Lower Campus Eagles took full advantage of 1:1 Technology, using it daily for classroom instruction and being active participants in our school wide Hour of Code, designed to inspire and motivate students to learn the importance of coding. Our after school enrichment program offered 15 different classes ranging from Chess, Yoga, and Gardening to Cheer, and Karate. These after school programs served 234 students throughout the 2017-18 school year. Further, we are proud of the many clubs, camps, and athletic teams at the Lower Campus that gave our Eagles the chance to participate and learn together, building the next generation of Kennedy athletes.

Without your time, talent, and support none of this would be possible. Your belief in the value of a Catholic education is the foundation of what we strive to do here each day. Our students will be the doctors, lawyers, judges, and social activists of tomorrow. They will change our world for the better like those who came before them, leaders of Courage, Integrity, and Dedication.

## Kindness Project

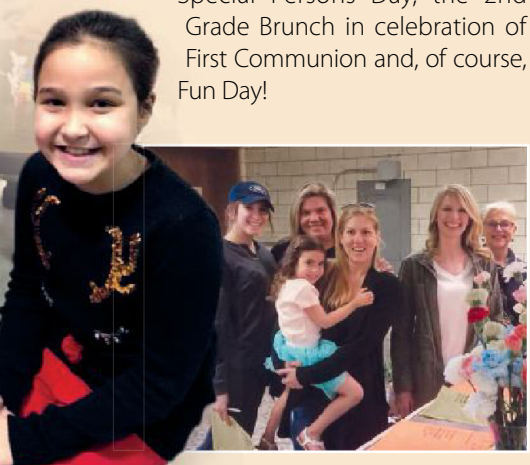

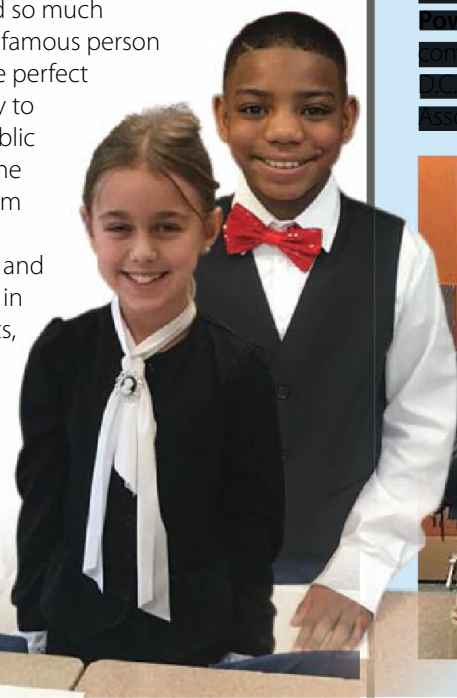

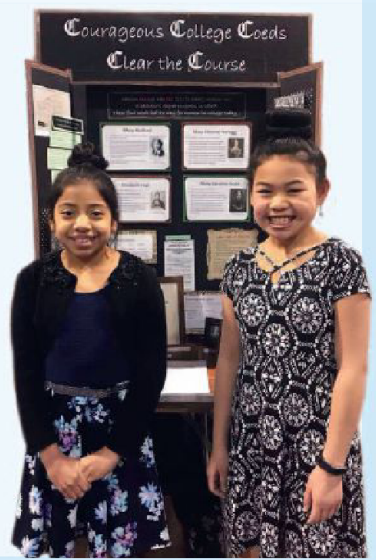
## Wax Museum

## History Day 2018

Kennedy was proud to send a team, for the second year in a row, to the national level of the National History Day competition at the University of Maryland this summer. The team of **Lisa Casey '24** and **Karla Constantine '24** placed 2nd at the state competition and represented the entire Mahoning Valley, as well as the state of Ohio, presenting on the 2018 theme: "Triumph and Tragedy in History." The intentional selection of the theme for NHD provides an opportunity for students to push past the antiquated view of history as mere facts and drill down into historical content to develop perspective and understanding. Congratulations to Lisa and Karla, among the top 1% of all competitors nationally for their accomplishments.



## Speech and Debate

The 2017-18 school year was unprecedented in the history of John F. Kennedy Speech and Debate. In addition to the high school program, Kennedy was the first school in our entire area to establish a full middle school speech and debate team in order to create a comprehensive 6-12 school program. Under the direction of program adviser and head coach **Mr. Anthony Catale**, the goals of establishing the middle school team are to expose Kennedy middle school students to the lifelong skill of public speaking at an earlier age and enhance the longstanding tradition of the Kennedy Speech and Debate program. As a result, the program added 40 middle school participants and achieved great success throughout the year. Kennedy capped off the season with four high school students qualifying for the Ohio Speech and Debate Association High School State Championship Tournament, twenty-three middle school students competing in the Ohio Speech and Debate Association Middle School State Championship Tournament with state Runner-Up finishes by **Jacob Conde '24** in Big Questions and **Matthew Powell '24** in Congressional Debate. Kennedy also sent **Cassidy Brozovich '19** to compete at the National Catholic Forensic League National Tournament in Washington and eleven middle school students to compete in the National Speech and Debate Association National Championship in Ft. Lauderdale, FL.





## “Joy For the Children”

We are so proud of our Kennedy students and their support of “Joy For Children”. This organization focused their aid specifically for children in Puerto Rico affected by Hurricane Maria this past fall. Under the leadership of **Mrs. Grizel Santiago**, our students organized fundraisers and dress down days to raise money that was used to give children a hot meal and cold drink as well as craft supplies and educational items. Students in Spanish Class followed up their work by filming a beautiful message, delivered completely in Spanish to Congressman Denis Marquez and filmed in our Think Lab, “You are not alone Puerto Rico. 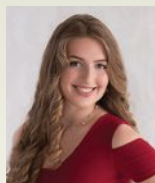

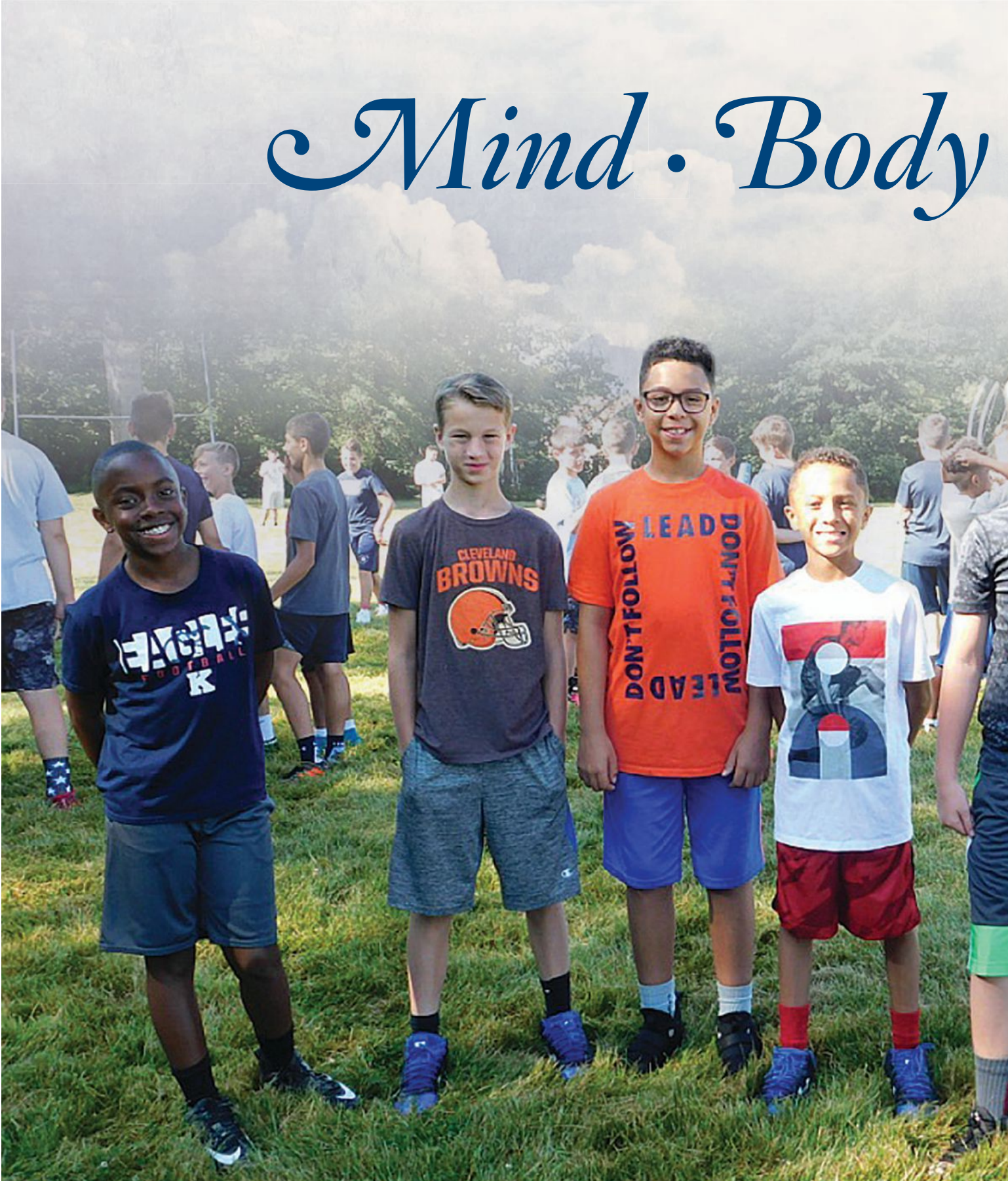

# Mind



Kennedy is committed to preparing our students to be "Future Ready"; a bold effort to maximize digital learning opportunities to help us move quickly toward preparing students for success in college, career, and citizenship in the global community. Last year, we made the commitment to and succeeded in being the first school in Trumbull County to make 1:1 Technology available for our students in all grades. This year, we kicked off the "All Hands On Tech" appeal at the "Just For Kicks" Live and Silent Benefit Auction for classroom resources, K-12, to create and innovate. Our Wish List included Makey Makey, Ozobots, Osmo, and Epson Interactive Projectors. To kick off the 2018 school year, 5 sets of Osmos with kits for coding, math, and spelling were purchased, along with a dozen Ozobots and accessories and 12 Makey Makey kits so our students could start to imagine and create right away!

## NASA Rover Project Uses 3D Printer

Junior High Technology Instructor, **Mrs. Brandi Bartoe**, attended an INVENTORcloud workshop funded by a grant from Ohio STEM Learning Network, on behalf of NASA Glenn, to create an engineering design challenge for middle and high school students to design wheels for a Mars Rover using the INVENT3D Printer. Her 6th and 7th graders started the project by preparing and presenting a Google Slide presentation on MARS Research. Next, they completed a Rover Research poster project and finally, built and tested their Rovers.

## Entrepreneurship Class/Projects

Entrepreneurship is a class that is student-led and project-driven. It is an environment where students learn business skills such as accounting, marketing, profit-cost as well as soft-skills such as interviewing a client, taking notes during face-to-face meetings and conference calls, and pitching ideas. Anchoring our projects around a 54" Latex Vinyl Printer, students are able to design, produce, and deliver on a variety of signage and products for the school and other clients. This authentic learning allows students to take risks in a safe-to-

fail atmosphere. Projects include customized graduate yard signs, concession stand menu, student-athlete fatheads, personalized static clings, and window skins for teacher classrooms. Students are also putting together a babysitting directory for Kennedy families and investigating producing vinyl transfers for spirit apparel.

## CenturyLink Clarke M. Williams Foundation Teachers and Technology Grant

John F. Kennedy Catholic School was the recipient of a \$50,000 CenturyLink Clarke M. Williams Foundation Teacher Technology Grant. A check was presented by **Mr. Joseph Ragozzini '88**, who serves as the Manager of Region Operations - Ohio East for CenturyLink. **Mrs. Alyse D. Consiglio**, Principal and **Mr. Shawn Mark**, Teacher submitted the grant on behalf of Kennedy.

The funds awarded will be used for our Think Lab

where students are encouraged to be Makers, Innovators, and Thinkers. The concept of our Think Lab is to give students the opportunity to use STEM and communication skills at different stations, focusing on a variety of content areas. These funds will allow us to add more stations including Ozobots that teach coding and computer science, Makey Makey that allows students to create inventions using a game board, wires, and alligator clips, and Lego Robotics kits where students are immersed in computer science and problem-solving. Our Think Lab changes instructional practice as teachers move from the "sage on the stage" to the "guide on the side". Students working at these stations are actively directing their own learning. The end result of 5 groups of students finishing a task is not five identical products, but five original products that solve the same problem. The skills gained will help students in ALL content areas. John F. Kennedy Catholic School is grateful to CenturyLink for their generous grant and the opportunities it will provide; the skills gained by being a Maker, Innovator, and Thinker will create successful students and leaders for the future.

## Hour of Code

Computers are everywhere, changing every industry on the planet, but fewer than half of all schools teach computer science. Girls and minorities are severely

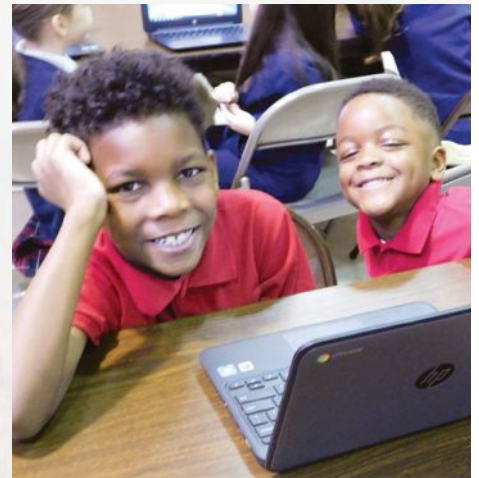


NASA Rover Project



underrepresented in computer science classes, and in the tech industry. The good news is, Kennedy is on our way to change this. That's why every one of our students, grades K-12, joined in on the largest learning event in history: The Hour of Code during Computer Science Education Week. With the Hour of Code, computer science dominated the homepages of Google, MSN, Yahoo!, and Disney. Over 100 partners joined together to support this movement. Every Apple Store in the world has hosted an Hour of Code. We are in good company!

Our Upper and Lower Campuses diligently coordinated this event so that every student in grades K-12 could participate in a one-hour activity using computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. We live in a world surrounded by technology. And we know that whatever field our students choose to go into as adults, their ability to succeed will increasingly depend on understanding how technology works.



# Body

The programming available at both the Upper and Lower Campuses to build physical strength and confidence in our students has grown exponentially over the past few years. We celebrate offering over 20 varsity level sports for our high school students and take pride in laying the foundation for our elementary students to form bonds as teammates early on, gain the necessary skill sets to be successful during competition, and provide a healthy outlet for our Eagles.

Thanks to Head Tennis Coach **Vicki (Vlahos) Orwig '93**, our Eagles had the opportunity to participate in clinics throughout the summer. Tennis is quickly becoming a popular sport with our younger set and a variety of days and times throughout the summer got them familiar with our coaching staff and put to good use our amazing tennis facility.

Camp With Champs was back this summer. Head Coach **Jeff Bayuk** and the Kennedy Football staff along with the entire Varsity Team put together a two day camp with games, contests, and one-on-one feedback for participants. The chance to play games under the helpful eye of our coaches gave the players the chance for invaluable feedback.

The Summer of Skill was looking for players

gearing up for the basketball improvement season. Head Boys Basketball Coach **Mark Komlanc** and his staff were dedicated to helping players who were motivated and willing to learn. The Gillen Gymnasium was open every day, all summer long, for students of all ages and skill levels.

This year, Kennedy has partnered with **Girls on the Run International**. Girls in grades 3-5 are invited to meet twice a week in small teams, to learn life skills through dynamic, interactive lessons and running games. The curriculum is taught by certified Girls on the Run coaches and includes three parts: understanding ourselves, valuing relationships and teamwork, and understanding how we connect and shape the world at large. Running is used to inspire



and motivate girls, encourage lifelong health and fitness, and build confidence through accomplishment. At each season's conclusion, the girls and their running buddies complete a 5K running event which gives them a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals. Our girls this year will have the chance to participate in the Girls on the Run 5K at the end of the season as well as the 5th Annual Tony Napolet Flying Eagle 5K.



# Spirit



Our school does small things with great love in our community and our ministry is continually growing. We emphasize kindness and volunteerism at every level, grades K-12. We also strive to make opportunities available for our students to nourish their minds, learn to be leaders, and gain confidence in the world around them. We are proud to share some of this programming with our Kennedy Family.

## 5th Annual Water Walk

In 2013, a team of 19 students, faculty and alumni from the Kennedy family traveled on a mission trip to rural Kenya, where they learned what it is like to live in a developing country. One of the activities was joining the village mamas on one of their daily water walks—walking upwards of 2 miles to the river, and then walking back to the village carrying 20 liters of water on their backs. The women must make this trip multiple times a day, and the water they collect is unsafe to drink. The people of rural Kenya lack basic access to clean water—while here, in the developed world, all we have to do to get a drink of water is turn on the tap.

To raise awareness of the lack of access to clean water in Kenya and throughout the developing world, Anna McCue '15 started the Living Water Project. Now in our fifth year, the event starts in the Dining Hall and then move outside to the school track, where participants will pick



up their 20L jerry cans and walk for 2 miles. Proceeds from this event benefit Free the Children's clean water projects.

## Day of Service

Kennedy teamed up with the Trumbull Neighborhood Partnership for the 2nd year to commit to a Day of Service, cleaning up and beautifying the neighborhood surrounding Kennedy and downtown Warren. One of their favorite projects was planting one of Warren Councilman John Brown's famous Buckeye trees at the Packard Park Tea Garden to culminate a solid day of clean-up.

## Helping Hands

Helping Hands is a volunteer service event based on Matthew 25:35 where Catholic communities package meals for the hungry overseas. Kennedy partnered and hosted Catholic Relief Services to allow our families to serve their brothers and sisters overseas in a tangible way. Rooted in the Eucharistic imperative to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world, we worked together to address hunger in both the short term and the long term. During the 2018 program, volunteers packaged over 15,000 meals to send overseas. "Go and make disciples of all nations," said **Tina (Makosky) McCue '82**, event organizer. "Feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked -- this is what Christ asked us to do. And so that's what we're here doing today -- feeding the hungry."

## Birds of a Feather

We are thrilled to announce a new, school-wide program called "Birds of a Feather". This program is designed to strengthen the bond between our Upper and Lower Campuses. Each Upper Campus House has been paired with a Lower Campus classroom. At Kennedy, we have inter-generational (grades 9-12) Houses instead of standard Homerooms. Each of our 11 Houses is named for a Saint, the Houses compete for points all year long based on academics, school spirit, fundraising and volunteer work and the competition caps off with our annual Olympic Day. The partnership will help to increase interest, excitement, school spirit, and confidence in our Little Eagles so as to better understand and embrace our Upper Campus. It will give our Big Eagles the chance to mentor their younger counterparts, lead service projects, and just have some fun!

Plans also include visits to the Lower Campus, tutoring opportunities, service projects, videos and messages, and invitations to games and special events throughout the year. We are excited to see how our students of all ages come together, just like a family, we flock together.

# The Performing Arts

We see Excellence all around us. In the classroom, on the field, in competition, or on the stage, and our students always rise to the occasion. From some of our littlest Eagles to our graduating class, we strive to surround our students with opportunity to shine. We are committed to giving our students the tools to participate in the Arts and Band Program as early as possible. By the time our students reach the Upper Campus, many are on their way to being superior performers.

## Band

John F. Kennedy made a commitment to bring back a viable band program for our students. We did so well growing our program over the past few years, Upper Campus band students were running out of room to practice, store their equipment, and practice with the gusto needed to prepare for their concerts and on-field performances. It was time to make a change.

Through the generosity of **The Cafaro Foundation**, Kennedy secured a \$100,000 grant to renovate the Wood Shop into our new Band Room. Our goal was to soundproof the space and install new flooring, lighting, electrical, seating, and storage areas. Work began at the end of the school year and we were proud to welcome our students into the newly renovated Band Room for the 2018-2019 school year. We currently have 42 musicians in the 6-8 Band and 6 musicians in the Upper Class

program, as well as a 22 member newly formed vocal choir. We are especially excited about The Pep Band program that has expanded to 27 members who will play for home Football and weekend home Basketball games.

Our music program is designed to give students a well rounded, comprehensive experience that will encourage students to grow as both recreational and, if they so choose, professional musicians. Our focus is to provide the foundation for each student to reach their full potential as a creative and unique individual while fostering the valuable skills of team work, self-control, discipline, leadership, innovation and initiative. Each class is designed with those goals in mind and includes state benchmarks for PK-12 arts education.





# The Performing Arts

## Drama

The Performing Arts program received a most generous gift on behalf of the **Covelli Family**. They chose to designate funds made in memory of **Mr. Albert Covelli** to be used to make significant upgrades to our stage lighting. Thanks to their generosity, our productions have risen to the next level, taking on a professional quality to match the gifts of our casts and crew.

Beauty and the Beast was our Winter Musical and included 50 performers and 20 crew members, starting with our 1st grade students! The students prepared for months and their hard work was evident as they performed for hundreds of guests over two days, the John F. Kennedy Theatre was bursting at the seams! Look for our Mary Poppins Winter Musical in 2019!

"We're all in this together"! Our Spring Production was High School Musical which boasted 27 cast and 15 crew members. Under the watchful eye of Director, Mrs. Jeanine Bofenkamp and our beloved Set Designer and Head of Lighting and Sound, **Mr. Fred Hodver**, the stage came to life with the sound of the East High School Wildcats!

"I continue to direct the show at Kennedy for one simple reason... the students! It is so important that they have the opportunity to show their God given talents on stage in addition to their academic successes. The dedication, and hard work amaze me. So many of my high school performers juggle school work, athletics, as well as jobs and still are willing to put in so much hard work to make every performance perfection. And that dedication is not lost on our Lower Campus students. They work just as hard during rehearsals and at home, learning all the songs and lines for our Winter Musical. 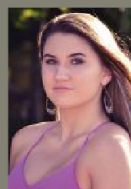

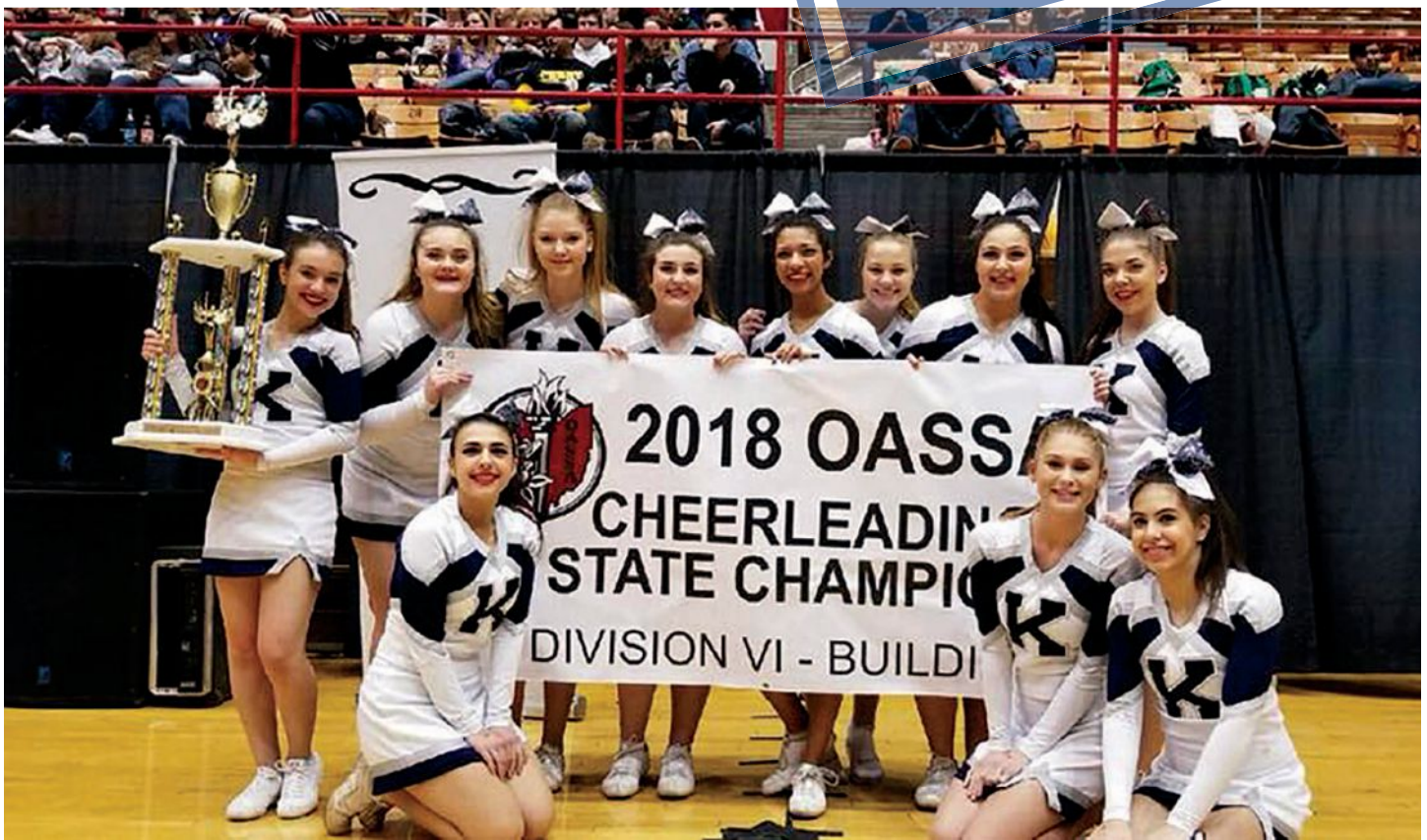

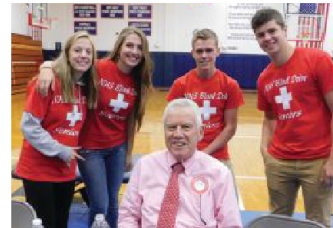




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
