

## **Upper Campus Experience**

Beginning in the Spring of 2022, Upper Campus has undertaken numerous significant capital improvement projects to enhance every aspect of student life. Over \$220,000 has been invested in these upgrades and improved the quality of our 55+ year structure.

### **Additional Enhancements**

The entire parking lot was resealed, repainted, and all potholes were filled. The cement sidewalks in front of the were removed, after removal it was

discovered that all the metal canopy poles needed to be cut and new legs were welded to the existing poles to ensure the safety of the canopy. New sidewalks were poured and custom Kennedy logos were stamped onto the sidewalks. After the

completion of the cement, the area was landscaped and custom window clings were installed on all main doors.










## Track & Field Resurfacing Project

We secured funding in the amount of \$80,000 to resurface the eight lane all-weather Eugene E. Rossi Memorial track. The projected completion date is Spring 2023. In order to prepare for the resurfacing a significant amount of overgrowth, trees, and vegetation had to be removed. The area to the right of the track was professionally excavated as well; the entirety of that project totaled \$80,000.



## **Boys Basketball Locker** Room

Boys Basketball began their locker room renovation project this summer. The locker room was 18 x 10 feet held twenty lockers and a whiteboard for scouting and game notes. The renovation expanded the space to nearly 18 x 18 feet. This expansion allows a more spacious and comfortable area to enable both film and study sessions.

The lockers were repurposed to better utilize the space, improved lighting and new electrical wiring was installed, as well as flooring. In addition to the expansion, the team purchased new seating, a study island with office chairs, television, and a custom Kennedy lit ceiling logo.



Our goal was to provide a locker room to be proud of and that parallels the immense time and effort our student athletes commit to the Kennedy Basketball program. We thank all of the generous donors for their commitment and willingness to make the locker room a reality.

Grace says, "the chance to physically cut wood, sand, and assemble a bed had a much bigger impact on me than just buying or donating something. I felt proud of the work I had done." Next, teams visit homes and personally deliver the beds and linens to a child in need. Julia cannot wait to go back next summer, "I felt so happy seeing the family that we were helping and giving them something that will really help a child sleep better at night."




#### Lemonade For a Cure






